 Our emergency crisis shelter provides survivors with a safe
 - place to stay when they report being in danger.
- 2,705 Counseling and Advocacy Sessions
 Advocates assist men, women, and children with safety planning, education, goal setting, and more.
 - Legal Advocacy and Court Accompaniment
 Clients recieve support with safety planning, court advocacy,
 navigating the legal system, filing personal protection orders,
 and referrals to legal services.
 - 725 Crisis Calls
 The 24 HR Crisis Line is available 365 days a year.
 - 87 Individuals Received Specific Assistance
 We provide clients with basic needs, such as food, clothing, bus passes, gift cards, and more.


